# Back to basics – How to Pray

Today we are beginning a Lent series of 4 Spiritual disciplines, which are key to being a Chrisitan. Today we begin by looking at prayer, and in particular How to pray. Over 3 more Sundays during Lent we will be considering "How to come to church", "How to read the bible" and "How to live for Jesus in the world".

It is recognised that prayer and praying is part of many different religious traditions, and that most people pray sometimes. The bible has much to say about prayer and praying, including in the Gospel of Matthew chapter 6 verse 5-15, today's bible passage which speaks of Jesus teaching his disciples how to pray, using the very familial prayer, we call The Lord's Prayer. Today it remains a really good framework to use when praying, and we will be saying it as part of our services in the benefice as we do every week.

John Calvin a 16<sup>th</sup> century French theologian understood prayer to be vital in the Christian life and viewed it as the "chief exercise of faith" and saw prayer as an intimate communion with the living God.

But if we are honest, most of us know we ought to pray, but we are not quite sure how. So, as well as looking at "What is prayer", we will also be considering some practical aspects of prayer .... "When to pray", "Where to pray" and "What to pray".

Even though I have been a Christian for many years, and pray daily, I still recognise that prayer is a mystery, even a puzzle.
